The Ministry of Culture and Communication notes the decision of the Paris Administrative Court, which cancels the classification decision prohibiting the viewing of the film "Salafis" to people aged under 18. The Ministry of Culture and Communication recalled that the Classification Board issued twice with a large majority an opinion in favor of a ban on under 18, for remarks and extremely violent and intolerant likely pictures to hit the public.

The Ministry of Culture and Communication will appeal the decision of the Administrative Court and request a stay of execution of that decision.

At the same time, to ensure the protection of youth and prevent this film can be accessible to all, pending the judgment of the Administrative Court of Appeal, Audrey Azoulay, Minister of Culture and Communication, will take urgent provisional classification action, prohibiting watching the film to people under 16 years.
